WF 10217 - Work Ability in Young Adult Survivors (WAYS)

Inclusion Criteria

- 1. 25-34 years of age at time of participation.
- 2. ≥2 to <10 years post-cancer diagnosis (per diagnostic pathology report).
- 3. Diagnosed with first cancer (any type except types listed in exclusion criteria below) at age ≥15 years.
- 4. Ability to understand and willingness to sign a written informed consent document.
- 5. Must be able to read and understand English.

Exclusion Criteria

- 1. Currently receiving active cancer treatment (acceptable to be on maintenance or hormonal therapies).
- 2. Life expectancy less than 6 months
- 3. Precancerous or pre invasive conditions (myelodysplastic syndrome; carcinoma in situ; non-melanoma skin cancer) without progression to malignancy without another prior primary cancer diagnosis. (Those who have had these conditions may participate IF they have a primary cancer diagnosis.)
- 4. As of Amendment 3, non-Hispanic Whites

SCHEMA

Work Ability in Young Adult Survivors (WAYS)

Study Population: Young Adult (YA) Cancer Survivors

Data collection: brief cognitive testing; detailed questionnaire assessing occupation, education status, a variety of work measures, and self-reported physical, psychosocial, and cognitive function; medical history, cancer treatment information, and medication use

Randomization: N/A

Intervention: N/A

Endpoints: levels of labor force participation, occupation and educational attainment of YA cancer survivors vs. national benchmarks

Stratification:

Current age 25-29 vs. 30-34 years and time since original cancer diagnosis 2 years to <6 years vs. 6 years to <10 years

Study Sample:

N=220 YA cancer survivors

Study Duration:

2 years
